

Guide for Authors: Requirements and formatting

The text of the article with a volume of up to **7 pages** (no more than 14 thousand characters) should be typed in Russian using the MS Word editor with a single interval, TimesNewRoman font, font size 14. All fields are 2.5 cm long. Paragraph indent 1.25 cm.

No more than **two declared authors** of one paper are allowed. One author can submit no more than **2 articles** to the conference.

It is mandatory to have an **annotation** (4-5 sentences) and **keywords** (5-6 words). The abstract should be an autonomous text that fully represents the main essence of the article, because the annotation quality defines the citation of a paper. The abstract should include the purpose of the study, the specified methods and the obtained results. It is very desirable that the annotation does not duplicate completely and without changes the text of a paper itself.

The article should have the structure of a full-fledged scientific publication and contain the following **structural elements**:

- introduction (relevance, purpose and objectives of the study);
- theoretical review on the research topic;
- data and methods;
- results and discussion;
- conclusion (conclusions, as well as originality, scientific novelty and practical significance).

Tables should have the headings placed above the table in the center. Tables should correspond to the design of the table from the design template, contain adequate information in the sidewall and header, and ensure the correlation of information vertically and horizontally. The link to the table is located in the text immediately before the table. It is necessary to specify the data sources given in the tables.

Formulas are drawn up in the MS Equation editor and numbered in the order of appearance. The text should contain a reference to the number of the corresponding formula.

Figures (diagrams and drawings) should have captions, be made in black and white and grouped. All drawings are provided in an editable format, either in *jpeg (or *jpg) or *tiff format, with a resolution of at least 72 dpi (screen resolution) and a size of at least 1500x1500 (dots per inch), or a size of 164 mm in width and a resolution of 300 dpi. The link to the drawing is located in the text immediately before the drawing. It is necessary to specify the data sources shown in the figures/diagrams.

References are given at the end of the article in accordance with GOST R 7.0.5-2008 (in the order of mention in the text). Articles without a list of sources are not accepted for consideration. The list of references should contain 5-7 sources, self-citation of no more than 10% is allowed. It is not recommended to use references to dissertations. References to scientific articles in reputable journals are welcome.

If the source has a DOI, it is necessary to indicate it at the end of the bibliographic reference. In the text of the article, the number of the source used from the list of references is placed in square brackets with the number (numbers) of pages indicated after the comma. If there are several link objects, then they are combined into one complex link. In this case, the reference objects are separated by semicolons. Examples of the design of a reference to a source in the text: [15]; [15, pp. 103-122]; [1, pp. 235; 32, pp. 18; 315, pp. 8-22]. Links to Internet sites, Internet sources (does not apply to author's articles, monographs, etc., posted on the Internet), educational and methodological literature (textbooks, manuals), regulatory and legal documentation (laws, resolutions, acts, etc.), statistical collections, newspaper publications are located in footnotes along the text and are not indicated in the list of sources.

Only original materials are published in the collection. All incoming manuscripts are checked for incorrect borrowings using the "Anti-Plagiarism" system. **The originality should be at least 80%.**
